A Message from the Saint Jude Pastor and Principal

Dear Saint Jude Alumni,

The rich traditions of Saint Jude continue as we embark on this new academic year. With an enrollment of 464 students we find more and more reasons to celebrate our past and look forward to a strong future. Our mission is to educate Saint Jude students in an ever-changing society by committing to quality instruction in spirituality, academics, and social behavior, within a Catholic School setting.

This year we are placing special emphasis on character building. By concentrating on the importance of making good choices and recognizing the need to be responsible and respectful of others, we hope to give our students the tools they need to be able to grow in their faith, courage, vision and commitment to Christian, Catholic values.

As Saint Jude School continues to search for ways to assure the health and safety of our children, we are constantly mindful of the need to evaluate our present structures and look for ways to improve the environment to which our children come each day. Over the years we have:

- ✧ added a school health professional;
- ✧ increased the number of paid and volunteer playground supervisors;
- ✧ added a radio communication system in order to enhance communication within the building and outside on the playground;
- ✧ installed security cameras at strategic points on the campus;
- ✧ initiated a security system which allows visitors to enter the building only if they have been “buzzed-in” by office staff;
- ✧ installed an improved fire/smoke alarm system in both the school and church;
- ✧ conducted monthly drills including fire, tornado and intruder alerts; and
- ✧ implemented the AlertNow program which allows instant communication with parents via e-mails, text messages and/or telephone calls for urgent updates.

This year we are pleased to announce that Mr. Mike Mullen has joined the Saint Jude staff as our new safety officer/ambassador. Mr. Mullen retired from the Milwaukee Police Department where he served as a police officer and investigator since 1985. Mr. Mullen has specialized training in law enforcement, First Aid and CPR. He has also worked with FEMA and held leadership positions within police organizations. In addition, Mr. Mullen is the father of Saint Jude student, Maire Cait, and Saint Jude graduates, Emily and Kelly. All of this, combined with his degree in education, make Mr. Mullen eminently qualified for this new position, and a perfect fit for our Saint Jude community. We are grateful to the Home and School Association for providing the money for this pilot program for the first semester. It is also hoped that Mr. Mullen will be able to explore ways to procure funding through grant writing or other avenues for the continuation of this service, and for more costly improvements such as additional security cameras and the upgrade of the existing video system.

The year has been off to a good start. Our students are actively involved in various service projects. They also have competed and have plans to participate in various academic competitions on the local, regional, state and national levels. Our many clubs are in full swing as students have opportunities to join the Forensics Club, Spanish Club, Science Club, Math Club and many other clubs which offer a chance for students to explore areas of interest outside the classroom setting. Later in the year we will be holding our annual Saint Jude Art Show. Under the direction of our art teacher, Mrs. Peggy Ziegler, this event is an opportunity to display the exceptional talents of our students. Finally, in the spring we look forward to our school play which is always an exciting adventure for both the performers and the audiences. This venture has grown over the years and the professionalism exhibited by all involved is impressive.

Our vibrant school is one which focuses on growth in all areas of faith, service, knowledge and responsibility, the four pillars of a Saint Jude education. With that in mind, we know that our future is one that is built on the strengths of those who have gone before us. For that, and so much more, we are most grateful as we transition from our celebration of Thanksgiving, to the Advent season of anticipation and preparation, and finally to the long-awaited birth of our Savior. Meanwhile, during all these seasons of celebration, we prayerfully remember you, our alumni in our prayers.

TECHNOLOGY UPDATE



Improving the school and its many programs is a mandate that requires vigilance and knowledge. Educational trends come and go, and we constantly evaluate to identify those that are valuable and those that lack lasting merit.



Interactive Smartboards are the latest technology available to schools and we are grateful that we have six of these in the classrooms. The interactive nature of the SMART Board provides many practical uses for the classroom. Using SMART Notebook software, teachers can record each step of a lesson activity for students to review at a later time. The flexibility of use in the classroom, including the multiple ways in which teachers can display information (interactive text, images, sound and video files), has been shown to facilitate instruction and support both differentiated learning and universal design for learning. Through the generosity of a number of individuals the Smartboard technology has been installed in six different classrooms and can be seen on all levels. Because of the expense, we were not able to equip all classes, but the hope is to phase in Smartboards throughout the school as additional funding becomes available. (Donations, large or small, are always welcome and greatly appreciated.) Right now, there are three Smartboards in the Middle School level in the science, math and social studies classrooms. Smartboards can be found in one classroom each in the kindergarten, primary and intermediate levels. Teachers who have the Smartboards received training during the summer and can be seen utilizing the technology as they work with their students.
